VISA REQUIREMENTS	A passport valid for six-months and evidence of immunization against yellow fever are required. Visas are required by all visitors to Burundi. Tourist visas can be extended at the immigration office in Bujumbura.
DRIVING LICENCE REQUIREMENTS	International Driving Permit.
GENERAL RULE OF THE ROAD	Traffic drives on the right hand side.
GENERAL ROAD CONDITIONS	There are main roads west from Bujumbura to Muramvya and center to Gitega. Both journeys can be completed without too much difficulty strain during the dry season, but any road travel can be difficult in rainy season. Roads can be subject to ambushes and are often closed during military operations; major roads are closed after 1600.
DOCUMENTATION FOR ENTRY OF FOREIGN REGISTERED VEHICLE	Registration papers and 3 rd party insurance cover is compulsory. It is normally possible to drive into Burundi from Congo (Dem Rep), either from the north or south. Roads from Rwanda are reasonable, but from Tanzania, poor. Visitors are advised against using the Bujumbura to Butare (Rwanda) road unless travelling as part of a UN convoy, due to the likelihood of ambushes. However the viability of crossing these borders depends on prevailing political condition and border areas can be very dangerous. Burundi's border with Congo (Democratic Republic) is liable to close at short notice.
FUEL	Burundi's supplies of gasoline and diesel fuel are imported and are relatively expensive due to high transportation costs. Service stations are rare outside of the major cities.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS	In an emergency: In Bujumbura: Centre Hospitalo-Universitaire de Kamenge (232048); Clinique Prince Louis Rwagasore (223881). Cash payment expected. In the provinces, contact regional health centers. Yellow fever vaccination required. Malaria is a serious problem. Cholera vaccination may be required in event of outbreak.
