<b>VISA REQUIREMENTS</b>	All visitors entering the DRC require a valid passport and a visa, as well as a yellow fever vaccination certificate. Special travel permits are needed for entry into the central mining regions; and other permits may be required, depending on the level of unrest in the area.
<b>DRIVING LICENCE REQUIREMENTS</b>	An international driving permit is required.
<b>GENERAL RULE OF THE ROAD</b>	Keep right.
<b>GENERAL ROAD CONDITIONS</b>	The roads are in poor condition, becoming almost impassable in the wet season. Outside Kinshasa and other main cities, most roads are barely driveable even with a 4x4, especially during the rainy season (September to May).
<b>DOCUMENTATION FOR ENTRY OF FOREIGN REGISTERED VEHICLE</b>	Vehicle registration papers and 3 <sup>rd</sup> party insurance cover is compulsory. The carnet is recommended in border crossing.
<b>FUEL</b>	Unleaded petrol available.

<b>HEALTH REQUIREMENTS</b>	Yellow fever and cholera vaccination. The country is a high-risk malaria area, and tropical diseases such as yellow fever, cholera, bilharzias and meningitis occur in rural areas. Medical facilities are limited and visitors are advised to carry their own full medical kits. Tap water is not safe to drink and should be boiled or purified. It is strongly recommended to take out comprehensive medical and travel insurance.
