VISA REQUIREMENTS	The passport needs to be valid for six months from date of entry into Lesotho and should have at least two blank pages. Most Commonwealth, SADC and EU nationals do not need a visa to enter Lesotho. A free entry permit that is valid for 30 days is given.
DRIVING LICENCE REQUIREMENTS	International Driving Permit is recommended and required for car hire.
GENERAL RULE OF THE ROAD	Driving is on the left hand side of the road. Seat belts are mandatory for driver and front seat passenger. If official or royal motorcade approaches, you are required to pull over and stop. Speed limit is 80km/h on main roads and 50km/h in villages.
GENERAL ROAD CONDITIONS	The majority of visitors to Lesotho arrive by road. Eleven border posts offer entry into Lesotho from South Africa. Because of the ruggedness of terrain in some parts of the Mokhotlong and Qacha's Nek districts, 4x4 vehicles are advised for these parts.
DOCUMENTATION FOR ENTRY OF FOREIGN REGISTERED VEHICLE	To bring a non-SADC-registered vehicle into Lesotho one must obtain a temporary import permit (TIP) or, depending on the country of origin of the vehicle, a carnet de passage. If the driver is not the owner of the vehicle, they must have a letter of authorisation from the owner for use of the vehicle in Lesotho. You will have to pay a small fee for a temporary road licence.
FUEL	Unleaded petrol available except in remote areas. Main service station in Maseru with other facilities in major towns. Carry jerry can with extra fuel and fill up when possible.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS	Vaccination for yellow fever. Medical facilities in Lesotho are limited. Tap water is considered safe to drink. However, drinking water outside main cities and towns may be contaminated. Health insurance is recommended.
