VISA REQUIREMENTS	Valid passport and visa.
DRIVING LICENCE REQUIREMENTS	A national driving licence is sufficient. International driver's licenses are recognized, but are only valid for one year.
GENERAL RULE OF THE ROAD	Keep right.
GENERAL ROAD CONDITIONS	<i>total: 49,837 km; paved: 5,781 km; unpaved: 44,056 km (1996 est.)</i> Tarred roads of varying quality link the main towns in the central highlands and continue to the most populous parts of the east and northwest coasts. Due to excessive rainfall in the regions land slides have depleted roads. Many roads are impassable in the rainy season (November to March).
DOCUMENTATION FOR ENTRY OF FOREIGN REGISTERED VEHICLE	Third-party auto insurance is obligatory and must be obtained from a company operating in Madagascar.
FUEL	Unleaded petrol available.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS	A yellow fever vaccination certificate is required from travellers coming from infected areas. Health insurance is strongly recommended; it should include cover for emergency repatriation. Private and public healthcare is available, but public facilities can be very limited. It is highly recommended that visitors bring medication for stomach upsets. Bottled water is highly recommended.
