| VISA REQUIREMENTS | Kenyan citizens are not required to obtain Visas to travel to Namibia for visits shorter than three months. |
| DRIVING LICENCE REQUIREMENTS | International Driving Permit is required Tourist traveling to Namibia can use their driver's license as long as they comply with the rules of the national roads of the country. The car rental companies may require international driving license, because the language use on the license is not English. It also depends from company to company. |
| GENERAL RULE OF THE ROAD | Traffic drives on the left side of the road. All passengers in the car must wear seatbelts The speed limit in urban areas is 60km/h, on tarred roads outside urban areas is 120km/h and on gravel roads outside urban areas is 100km/h. Gravel roads can be unpredictable. Do not drive too fast; it is easy to lose control of your vehicle. |
| GENERAL ROAD CONDITIONS | Roads are generally well maintained. There are 64,799km (40,266 miles) of road, of which 7841km (4872 miles) are tarred. |
| DOCUMENTATION FOR ENTRY OF FOREIGN REGISTERED VEHICLE | All foreign registered vehicles entering the country must pay an amount of N\$120.00 per vehicle and N\$80.00 per trailer. You need a sticker that identifies the country you are coming from. |
| FUEL | Fuel is regularly available; however some fuel points indicated on maps no longer exist. It is generally recommended that you fill up at every town en-route to your destination as to insure that you always have ample fuel. |
| ACCOMODATION | Strongly advised to secure accommodation before arrival, ad-hoc arrivals at some places can be accommodated. www.hannamibia.com www.diningoutnamibia.com |
| HEALTH REQUIREMENTS | Medical services in Namibia are of a very high standard. However, the availability of most services is restricted to the main towns. Emergencies and accidents that occur in remote areas do attract a high cost when transport to the main towns is required. Quality of tap water is excellent in most places. Vaccinations for yellow fever for people coming from affected countries, and vaccinations for malaria for people going to affected places in Namibia are required. |
