VISA REQUIREMENTS	Visas are required by nationals of all countries. They can be obtained at your point of entry.
DRIVING LICENCE REQUIREMENTS	Kenya Driving licence valid for the duration of the stay provided it bears a photograph of the holder and is in English. An international driving permit is recognized and advisable especially when hiring a vehicle, it is also best to accompany one's local licence.
GENERAL RULE OF THE ROAD	Drive on the left and overtake on the right. Emergency service vehicles and official state vehicles have priority, unless otherwise indicated by signs. At a roundabout, drivers must give way to traffic on the right and to vehicles already circulation on the roundabout. Seat belts compulsory for front seat occupants of the vehicle if fitted.
GENERAL ROAD CONDITIONS	Roads are tarred with the main trunk roads (2-4 lanes) in a fair condition and the local distributor roads (1-2 lanes) in a poor state. Motorists are expected to encounter potholes.
REQUIREMENTS FOR ENTRY OF FOREIGN REGISTERED VEHICLE	Two white reflex reflectors are required on each side of the front bumper and two red reflex reflectors on each side of the rear bumper. Carnet is not compulsory but strongly recommended or vehicle temporary import permit for up to 12 months is available at the border posts, which is usually limited to the visitor's authorized length of stay. Proof of ownership for the vehicle is required e.g letter of authority from owner and a police clearance certificate. PTA Insurance/comesa yellow card obtained from the countries local insurers or a 3 rd party insurance cover is available at the border posts. Entering Zimbabwe via Beitbridge the toll fees are payable.
FUEL	Zimbabwe has suffered unreliable fuel supplies for the past six years.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS	It is advisable to take anti malarial drugs when visiting Zimbabwe. Yellow fever vaccination is required for travelers from infected areas as designated by the World Health Organisation as of 1993. It is recommended to only drink bottled water. Medical care in Harare and Bulawayo is very good but in other areas it is limited so it is a good idea to take with you your own basic medical aid kit.
